

Since 1965, The Cosanti Foundation has been dedicated to influencing the way the built world is created in balance with the environment. Established by the late theoretic architect Paolo Soleri (1919–2013), The Cosanti Foundation has published many scholarly explorations of Soleri's theories on arcology – a portmanteau of "architecture" and "ecology" – and Soleri's treatises on urban planning where people, not cars, are what cities of the future are built around. The Cosanti Foundation also features select titles by other authors and publishers who've written on Soleri and his pioneering theories.





Paolo Soleri reformulates the design of cities through his masterful concept of "arcology," the fusion of architecture with ecology. In his book, *Arcology: The City in the Image of Man,* he proposes a revolutionary multi-use, compact and threedimensional urban habitat for humankind. First published in 1969, The Cosanti Foundation has proudly reprinted this handsome 50th Anniversary Limited Edition featuring new illustrations and a foreword by architect Tomiaki Tamura, a longtime Arcosanti resident and former co-president of The Cosanti Foundation.

The pioneering designs Soleri presents in this landmark book are the antithesis of urban sprawl. Convinced that thoughtfully designed architecture had the power to bring people closer to each other and closer to the land, Soleri broke from his industry's trend of exploiting the Earth's natural resources and instead, advocate for architecture that was multi-use, vertical, and integrated.










Paolo Soleri: Architecture as Human Ecology (English)




